



What is ANSI and what is its role in standards development?

ANSI (American National Standards Institute) is a federation of organizations (business, labor, government, trade associations, etc.) that establishes and enforces the procedural rules of consensus though which American National Standards (ANS) are approved. ANSI accredits approximately 230 different standards developing organizations (SDOs) around the U.S. to develop ANS within the limitations of their approved scopes. If a standard is accredited by ANSI, it means ANSI has recognized and verified that the requirements for due process, balance, openness, and consensus have been met by B11 Standards, Inc. ANSI does not publish or develop any standards, however, they are a licensed reseller for most SDOs, including B11 Standards, Inc.
